Objectives/Outcomes

- ✓ What is the overall theme/s in this written work?
- ✓ What are the thoughts, feelings, perceptions you feel Chiasson is trying to convey in the work?
- ✓ How would you describe the place depicted in this writing?





The Instruction

Create

Students are asked to write a tweet, 140 characters, based on a theme, sentence, feeling, thought or personal point of view portrayed in Chiasson's "Peaceful Land". Discuss and display your tweets.

Closure/Assessment (this can be completed with an exit ticket, journal writing or class discussion)

- ✓ What elements of the writing did you like and dislike? Why?
- ✓ Why do you think other people should read this written work?
- ✓ What do you think is worth remembering about this written work?
